Advanced manufacturing companies use innovative technologies to improve products or processes. The hiring event will be held at the Rowan College of South Jersey, Cumberland Campus, from 9:00 a.m. to 1 p.m. Interested applicants will drive in to the event and receive hiring event packets that will include the job openings, job title, job description, location, wages and application information for positions with over 30 local businesses. The event will include a location designated for attendees to complete and return job application information.
